- II 1613 Altered and modernised. A block of one storey buildings grouped round a courtyard with a well near the centre. Glean washed rubble stone with slate roof. Stone chimneys. Most of the windows are modern steel casements. The individual houses have plain and mostly modern doors. The main entrance to the court is by a central passage from the road, with an external archway of dressed stone with a chamfered edges and drip mould, chamfered keystone. The spandrels have small shields. The elevation to the road has 8 windows, the central passage entry and one secondary door. The windows and doors in the court are irregular. Over the entrance to the passage

is a rectangular panel with date 1613 and initials D.H. On the east side of the church is a similar stone panel with initials R.B. and a bull's head with same date. On the west side a third similar panel with date 1937 and initials R.H. W.B. and a bull's head.

Founded by David Hughes and R. Bulkeley in 1613. Restored by R. Williams Bulkeley in 1937.
