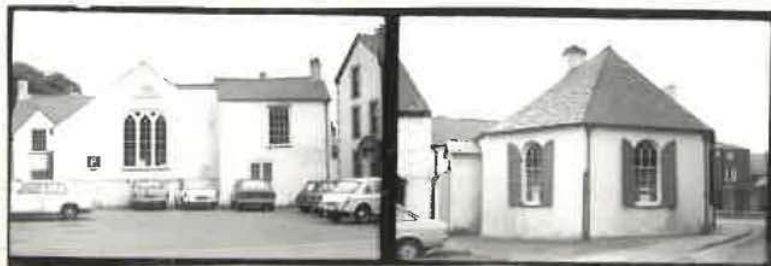

Outstanding Conservation Area

II* 1614, altered and added to, C19. Originally a large rectangular room with vestibule at angle at S.W. but early C19 3 window bay added at E. end to form Grand Jury Room and other small additions N+S make plan more irregular. Mainly single-storey, lesser additions 2 storeys. Roughcast. Roof of modern slates. Vestibule has arched entry and original oak door (and furniture) under elliptical head, and 2-lt. mullioned window. Early C19 fenestration includes large W. window of 3 panes light with semi-elliptical head under drip-mould and others with Gothic gable boss. Interior has original roof of 3 simple hammer-beam trusses, plastered between rafters. C19 circular top, light in ceiling E. bay of court. Original wooden cover across

Wall behind judges seat (over which is Victorian coat of arms). Across middle of court is early C19 iron railing. Small galleries in added N and S transepts' a simple Tuscan metal posts. Room over vestibule has moulded wooden mantelpiece over delicately detailed cast-iron fireplace and moulded cupboards between 4 pilasters.
