Outstanding Conservation Area

- II* Originally a house of c1400. Altered in C17 and restored and converted in recent years. Probably built with wings at each end of open hall, but no features of N. wing survive and S. wing (present front range) is much altered. Hall has 3 trusses of arch-braced type with collars and wind braces, with some moulding and carving. A floor was inserted to divide the hall into 2 storeys in C17 or earlier. The floor beams and the skeleton of former partition on upper storey remain, together with the chimney inserted in for bay with open hearths on each floor. Modern stair in for bay. Some wattle infill to partitions survives on upper storey.
- The S wing had the ground floor front wall removed in the C17 when the

house was extended to the present frontage, and all partitions have been removed in C20 conversion to shop.

Street front is timber framed, of 2 low storeys. Rendered upliff. Two 3-light fixed and casement windows on 1st floor, the right hand one an early C17 one with C18 light in a projection, with gable overhanging above. Base of projection is rubble, supporting wooden lintel over probably Victorian shopfront. Left-hand section of front has original ground floor wall cut away and a C19 lean-to projection built on (with plain 15-pane window and double doors each of 2 panels). Both sections of front are close-shutted above, the gabled ends in zig-zag (RCHM 4)
