

Sian Rees' description (Pemb SAMs) basically correct, but the back end of the chamber appears to be supported by a third side stone. The earthen floor is certainly modern silt, as a local resident recalls playing within the chamber as a child. The farmer has in the past dumped material around the chamber, but has apparently had the error of his ways explained to him.
