Cave entrance in base of living rock
 situated below Gal Cave. Two entrances, which interconnect, extending into
 hillside for c. 10-15 m.
 The site was recorded by excavation and two
 trenches can be seen in the field to the S of
 the mouth of the cave. Although extensively
 investigated, no artefacts were seen. It seems likely
 that some deposits may survive in part of the
 cave mouth - traces of debris deposit seen
 with a cave suggesting this was also not
 completely eroded.

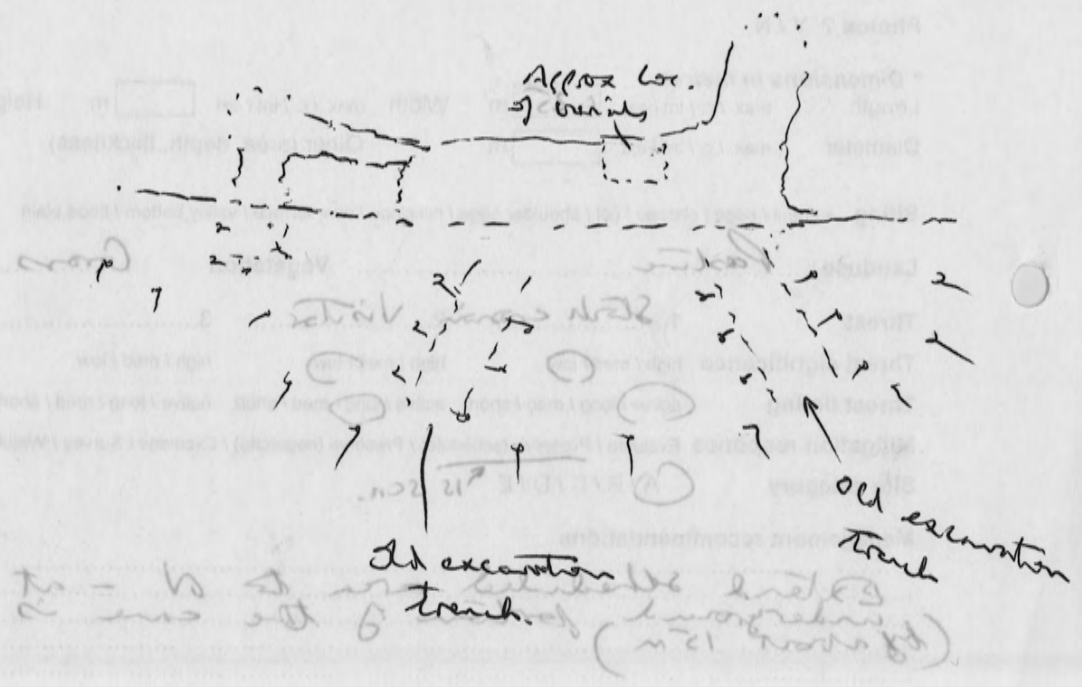
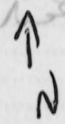

Two entrances were observed, entering into the site from the base of lower rock outcrop (below Golf Course).
The site was roughly rectangular and the perimeter fence was seen in both north and south of the site. Although extensive investigation over the years, it seems likely that some defect may have occurred in front of the site north - fence of concrete defect seen with - concrete supporting fence was not completely visible.
