Introduction

Location and Topography (Figure 1)

The National Trust cares for over 5000 ha of the Brecon Beacons, approximately 3316 ha of which forms a coherent block of land, approximately 10 km long and 5 km wide, running from Cwm Llysiog in the south to Nant Cwm Llwch in the north and between the valleys of the Taf Fawr and the Taf Fechan. There have been two previous seasons of fieldwork carried out in 2008 and 2009 and the current season completes the survey area. The current fieldwork took place12th January and 21st January 2011.

The current survey area covers at total of approximately 1250 Ha in two blocks (Figure 1). The first block ran north from Pont ar daf to Carno Woods including the valley of Glyn Tarrel It covered a total of approximately 388 Ha. The second area was to the west including the valleys of Blaen Taff Fechan, Cwm Sere and Cwm Cynwyn with an area of approximately 862 Ha.

Archaeological Background

The property was given to the National Trust in 1965 by the Eagle Star Insurance Company.

The property was originally surveyed by Skeats in 1995 resulting in some 514 records for the whole survey area. An assessment survey by the Clwyd-Powys Archaeological Trust in 2002 of an area in the north of the property on the slopes and top of Allt Du and slopes of Pen Milan (Silvester and Hankinson 2002) suggested that there were difficulties in using Skeats' survey because of

locational inaccuracies and inconsistencies within the recording system. Engineering Archaeological Services Ltd was therefore commissioned to resurvey the property.

The initial phase of field work, carried out in 2008, generated 35 records within an area of 720 hectares between Cwm Llysiog and Nant Crew to the south of the property. The second phase, carried out in 2009 added a further 190 records from an area of 1800 Ha The majority of these features were post-medieval in date and associated with the agricultural exploitation of the area. Limited evidence for modern military activity, medieval settlement and a few prehistoric funerary monuments were also recorded.

SUMMARY

142 monuments were recorded from the 1250 ha surveyed in 2011. This gives a total of 367 monuments from the total of the area surveyed in the Brecon Beacons.

As with the previous surveys the majority of the features recorded were associated with post-medieval agricultural activities such as sheep folds and pens, wall, boundary banks and clearance cairns. Only limited quarrying activity was recorded in the 2011 survey area. There is also limited evidence for Post-Medieval and Medieval settlement activity.

Prehistoric activity was largely limited to a range of funerary monuments including a group of ring cairns on the south west slopes of Gwaun Taf. One enclosure within Glyn Tarrel may be of prehistoric date as is a circular platform on the northern end of Y Gryn.

Methodology

Prior to carrying out the fieldwork the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales' online data base, "Coflein" and the Clwyd Powys Archaeological Trust Regional Sites and Monuments Record, were consulted for relevant records (Figures 3 – 5). This data was plotted onto a base map together with features noted from the First Edition Ordnance Survey1:10560 maps published in 1890 and 1891 (Figure 2).

Where possible, the survey area was walked in a series of parallel transects, however, the landscape of the survey area was not conducive for strict transects, thus blocks of land were walked in transects and the track facility on the hand held GPS was used to ensure a consistent coverage.

Recording was carried out using proforma recording forms to record basic information on the features located. Information recorded was consistent with the National Trust Historic Building Sites and Monuments Record (HBSMR). The positions of the features investigated were recorded using a "Garmin Etrex Summit" hand held GPS using the WAAS correction, thereby giving a potential accuracy of ± 2m. Digital photographs at a resolution of 14 mega pixels were taken. These included 1 m metric scales or a human scale where practical.

Data was subsequently transferred to the HBSMR data template spreadsheet with an accompanying map presented as a MapInfo table.

The summary of the recorded sites can be found in Appendix 1 while full details are given in Appendix 3. Distribution and locations of recorded sites are shown in Figures 6 - 8.

Review of Correlation Between New and Existing Records

Figures 3 - 5 show the outcome of a basic desk top review for the property. Features shown include all those included in the Clwyd Powys Archaeological Trust (CPAT) Historic Environment Record, those which appear in the National Monuments Record (Coflien) and those which appear on First Edition Ordnance Survey Maps. By far the majority of data points are from the CPAT Historic Environment Record and include records made by CPAT field workers and others, records made previously by R Skeats for the National Trust, finds spots and records created from maps, aerial photographs and documentary research. There are also inevitably a number of duplicate records.

It is therefore an over representation of what is to be found on the ground today.

During the implementation of the survey every attempt was made to correlate features observed with those previously recorded. This proved particularly difficult in the field and much relied on comparison of locations and descriptions afterwards. Most, but not all, of the problems encountered were with those records made previously by R. Skeats for the National Trust. It became apparent that in the absence in the past of GPS equipment, that many previous records were mis-located. It also became apparent that some natural features had mistakenly been recorded as possible sites. There seems to have been a tendency to over record, with some features being recorded twice, and individual pits recorded separately within quarried areas which have been given a single number in the new record.

It is therefore stressed that the current survey (Figures 6 - 8) provides a new and definitive record of what can be found on the ground today. Where possible a correlation between new and existing record numbers has been made and a summary of this is given in Appendix 2.

A more detailed comparison of all records detailing those which could not be located is given in Appendix 3.

Survey Results

143 features were recorded in the 2011 survey. Of these 56 were within the eastern survey area of Glyn Tarrel, whilst 87 features were recorded from the western survey area. Once again there is a concentration of activity within the river valleys, although a limited number of sites were located on the higher ground. (Figures 6-8)

Prehistoric Activity

Only a limited number of prehistoric sites were located. These tend to be funerary monuments, although the possibility of settlement activity is recorded at two sites.

On the western side of Glyn Tarrel the large cairn (860256) is a scheduled monument (BR235 (POW)) some 15 m in diameter and standing to a height of about 1.5 m. There is some evidence that this monument has been subject to antiquarian investigation. Approximately 235 m to the south is an enclosure (860259) which contains no obvious signs of medieval or post-medieval activity and may therefore be prehistoric in date.

The eastern side of Glyn Tarrel has only two possible prehistoric monuments. There is mound of uncertain date 860271 which may be the remains of a barrow or cairn. There is also a platform cut into the hill slope at the northern end of Y Gyrn which has a roughly circular shape 860297 and may, therefore, be the remains of a prehistoric circular building.

The prehistoric activity within the western survey area was concentrated within the valley of Blaen Taf Fechan. There is a group of three scattered ring cairns (860310, 860312 and 860314) on SW slopes of Gwaun Taf, although not all of these are within the survey area. These may be related to a larger funerary landscape which included the cairns in the Upper Neuadd reservoir, outside the survey area and Cairn 860333 at the southern end of Gwaun Perfedd.

There is also an isolated mound (860316) at NW end of Gwaun Taf which may be a cairn or barrow.

Medieval Settlement Activity

Demonstrable medieval settlement activity is restricted to four areas. Two of these are within the eastern survey area.

On the western flanks of Y Gyrn, located between two streams, 860272 consists of a rectangular platform 11 x 5 m in size with an attached enclosure 22 x 30 m in size.

Approximately 1400 m to the NE of 860272 is a group of platforms on the NW sector of Y Gyrn. (860295, 860300, 860301 and 860305). These are all scheduled ancient monuments (BR 390. BR391, BR392 and BR393) and are scattered over approximately 260 m of hill slope at about 410 m OD. It is not certain whether these platforms are contemporary and their relationship with a series of earth and stone banks in the same area (860296, 860302, 860303 and 860304) is also not clear. It is clear, however that these features pre-date the track 860300.

Within Cwm Cynwyd, in the eastern survey area there are two farmsteads which are probably of medieval date (860360 and 860361, Figure 9). The largest of these (860360), contains three rectangular building platforms and an associated field system. The platforms range in size from 6 x 4 m to 9 x 3 m in size, two of which appear to be incorporated into the field system, defined by stone and earth banks, and the third sits just outside. The field system covers an area of approximately 65 x 50 m and includes the remains of at least three fields.

Only 120 m to the NE 860361 consists of a single rectangular platform 5 x 2.5 m in size siting within a field system covering an area approximately 42 x 2 m in size with at least two fields defined by stone and earth banks. It is possible that these

two sites are related to each other and to a third enclosure (860369, PRN 5278) 100 m to the west of 860360 which was not visited during the survey.

There are also two possible platforms on the slopes of Cwm Sere (860366 and 860367) both of which are aligned along hill slope.

Post Medieval Settlement Activity

20 platforms or remains of structures were located which are assumed to be evidence for the Post-Medieval settlement within the survey area. Seven of these are within the eastern survey area. Only a few of the structure have any firm evidence for the complexity of the structure.

860231 is towards the southern end of the eastern survey area. It is a two room structure with sufficient stone to suggest that it had dry stone gables and possibly a chimney at its SE end. It was located at the NW end of a field system formed of walls 860226, 860992 (Pont ar Daf) and 860230 which probably represents the field system associated with the now demolished Storey Arms. A few sherds of post-medieval pottery were noted in the mole hills around this site.

At the southern end of the land farmed by Blaen Glyn Farm 860288 was a complex of structures including a three celled building 19 x 6 m in size (Figure 10). Slightly to the north west are the remains of a second building 3 x 4 m in size with a stone platform to its north west. This platform appears to be at a similar level to a short length of dry stone walling blocking the adjacent stream. It is possible that the platform is a leat support and that the second structure housed either a water wheel or a tank which was fed from the stream. The structure complex would also appear to be related to a field system on the

northern bank of the stream (860287) which appears on the Ordnance Survey map (Brecknockshire XXXIII SW 1891) although the buildings are not evident on this map. It is not certain whether the buildings were already ruins in 1891 and therefore not mapped or that they postdate the mapping. It would seem most likely that they pre-date the Ordnance Survey map given the state of decay recorded in the survey.

The remaining five platforms within the eastern survey area (860243, 860265, 860269, 860281 and 860289) are scattered across the landscape. In general they have little structural information surviving being little more than rectangular platforms. Two are associated with other features, however. 860243 is associated with a large, triangular shaped raised area adjacent to the property boundary and 860265 would appear to be associated with a small quarry (860264).

There is a concentration of eleven structures along Blaen Taf Fachan and an adjacent, parallel, stream on Gwaun Perfedd. Varying in size between 3 x 3 m to 10 x 6 m in size, these structures are difficult to interpret. Only two features (860345 and 860348) have the remains of hearths or chimneys suggesting they were at least partly domestic in nature.

The function of the remaining structures is uncertain, they may sheep pens or small folds, however, their rectangular plan, proximity to each other and lack of tumbled stone or dry stone walls would suggest they may be the remains of small buildings or huts.

Two small structure platforms were recorded in Cwm Cynwyn. The smaller of which (860359) is a rectangular structure of tumbled dry stone walls defining an area of 5 x 2.5 m. The rather

rough construction suggests this may have been a sheepfold, although the regular shape leaves this interpretation in doubt.

The larger structure (860364) is 13 x 3 m in size and is divided into two cells (Figure 11). It also sits within a field system defined by the earthen banks 860362, 860363 and 860364 along the western banks of Nant Cynwyn

Post Medieval or Earlier Relic Field Systems

Whilst the majority of boundary banks or walls can be related to the modern field divisions there is some evidence for previous field systems within the survey area. In the western survey area there are remnants of at least three field systems which are no longer in use. At the southern end of the survey area the tumbled dry stone walls (860226 and 860230) extend a field system recorded in the survey of Pont ar Daf (Brooks 2010) which appears to be associated with the now demolished Storey Arms Inn. This field system also appears to be associated with an isolated building (860231) which is at the north western end of this field system.

The second field system is represented by a range of earth and stone banks in the southern end of the land farmed by Blaen Glyn Farm, to the west of the Afon Tarell Figure 10). This is most developed at its southern end (860287) where it is associated with a range of buildings (860288 and 860289 alongside one of the streams. Other fragments of this field system survive to the north (860274, 860276, 860277, 860278, 860280, 860284 and 860286). 8602274 is of particular note as it includes an original gateway marked by upright stone slabs defining a 1.5 m gap in this dry stone wall.

On the northern flanks of Y Gyrn there is the fragment of a field system formed of the low earthen banks 860296, 860302, 860303 and 860304. It is not certain whether this field system is associated with the platforms 860295, 860301, 860305 and 860306 which occupy a similar area to the field system.

In the western survey area there are fragments of field systems in Cwm Cynwyn. At the northern end of Cwm Cynwyn, near to the point where the track 860352 enters the survey area, there are two banks (860350 and 860351) which are probably part of a relict field system. 860350 cuts across the end of a spur, whilst 860351 is nearer to the gateway and is less well defined.

Along the western bank of Nant Cynwyn a series of earthen banks (860362 and 860363) form a series of fields along the stream (Figure 11). This system also has a single platform 860364 and small paddocks at its northern end.

The field systems associated with 860360 and 860361 have already been discussed; however, the aerial photograph of this area shown on Google Earth (http://maps.google.co.uk/maps?ll=51.887444,-3.4058237&z=16&t=h&hl=en-GB) suggests that there may be a larger field system shown as crop mark only (Figure 9).

Post Medieval Sheepfolds and Pens

A total of 13 sheep folds and a further 16 small pens have been recorded from the survey area reflecting the main agricultural activity within the area. In general it is assumed that the larger, better preserved sheepfolds (860227, 860260, 860290 and 860344) are of a later date than the smaller, less well preserved structures.

There is a concentration of sheepfolds and small pens along the Blaen Taf Fachan, reflecting the pattern already noted for the Post-Medieval settlement pattern. The function of all of the structures is not certain and several of the structures appear to have been built on an earlier platform or within the remains of an earlier structure (860319, 860321, 860325, 860323, 860330 and 860338) suggesting that the pattern may not be as simple as it initially appears. 860319 and 860321 have previously been recorded as post-medieval longhouses by Skeats, although this interpretation would appear to be optimistic.

Post Medieval Quarrying Activity

Only a limited evidence for quarrying activity was recorded. A small informal quarry (860264) was recorded adjacent to a stream above Blaen Glyn farm which appear to be associated with a structure platform (860265).

More extensive evidence of quarrying was located on the northern end of Y Gyrn. This included Carno Wood Quarry (860294) and a series of intercutting quarry scoops forming three groups of quarries (860298, 860299 and 860307) along the break of slope of Y Gyrn. All of these quarries appear to be exploiting the slabby rocks of the area.

Post Medieval Trackways

Two major tracks cross the survey area. 860250 was clearly a major route running from Old Glanrhyd to Storey Arms and is known locally as "the Old Coach Road" (Daggett pers. comm.) Running along the eastern side of the valley it either was a predecessor of the current A470, or at least an alternative route. The status of this route can be demonstrated by the three stone built bridges (860252, 860254 and 860263) over which the track passes. There is

some evidence from Bridges 860252 and 860254 that these bridges have been subjected to a programme of maintenance and major re-building reflecting the status of the route they carried.

The second major route way runs through Cwm Cynwyn, crossing the ridge of Craig Cwmoergwm at Bwlch ar y Fan and continuing out of the survey area towards Pont Cwmfedwen (860352). This track is still in use, largely for agricultural access, although the rescue services also use the track.

Four other tracks were also recorded.

Post Medieval and Modern Boundaries and Markers

21 banks and 14 dry stone walls were recorded in the survey area. In general the impression is that the stone walls are probably either of a later date than the earthen banks or are used for favoured locations. The dry stone walls tend to be used for major boundaries such as the boundary between the farmed land and open moor or along major track ways. It is assumed that many of the banks originally were topped with hedges.

Two upright stones (860308 and 860346) are assumed to be boundary markers. One of these (860308) is inscribed with the letters "CH" on its eastern face. These do not appear to reflect the local parish names and may therefore mark a change in ownership.

There is also a wooden post (860229) supported by a pile of stones on the northern end of Y Gryn.

Post Medieval Features

Three water control features of postmedieval date were also recorded. Adjacent to Blaen Glyn Farm there is the remains of a concrete tank and leat system (860232) which is assumed to be part of the water supply system for the farm. There is also a leat (860248) leading from the farm to the Glyn Tarrel.

At the southern end of land farmed by Blaen Glyn Farm there are the remains of a dam with a sluice across one of the streams. The sluice consists of a brick face on the dam walls with a slot to take a series of timber boards (860291). It is assumed that this water control system was used to produce a sheep washing area.

Other Features

Five clearance cairns (860228, 860247, 860257, 86028 and 860283) were located during the course of the survey. These are assumed to be relatively modern in date as are the two walker's cairns (860349 and 860331)

There is a man-made pond within Carno Wood (860292) which was constructed by building a bund along the north, west and eastern side of the pond. The original function of this feature is unknown.

The south western flanks of Cwm Cynwyn has a series of twelve small piles of stone distributed over an area of 65 x 40 m. each of the piles contain stones of similar sizes. It is assumed that these are deliberate collections from the surrounding natural scree in preparation to removal of these stones for building activities.

Conclusions

The 2011 works completes the survey of the land owned by the National Trust in the Brecon Beacons. And this report should be read in conjunction with the previous reports (Brooks and Laws 2008, Laws and Brooks 2009).

Prehistoric activity would appear to concentrate in Gwaun Taff with a

collection of ring cairns. These may also relate to the known Bronze Age cairns in the Upper Neuadd Reservoir and Cairn 860333 forming a funerary landscape in this valley. Only limited possible prehistoric settlement sites were recognised. A single circular platform (860297) is on the northern end of Y Gyrn and a possible enclosure (860259) is adjacent to the Afon Tarell.

Three major Medieval settlement sites have been recorded. One of these comprises the Scheduled platforms of 860295, 860301, 860305 and 860306 and a possibly associated field system and is located at the northern end of Y Gyrn. It is surprising therefore that these relatively slight remains are scheduled whilst the much better preserved remains of 860360 and 860361 are not. All of these remains indicated a level of Medieval activity in the uplands which is not present in the current day.

This level of activity extended into the Post Medieval period with both field systems, sheep folds, sheep pens and possible domestic structures scattered throughout the survey area. There is, however, a concentration of activity along the Blean Taf Fachan with both agricultural and domestic structures having been defined.

The western survey area would appear to have been divided between two properties. Whilst the majority of the area can be associated with Blaen Glyn farm (previously called Pen-y-Waun on the 1891 Ordnance Survey map), the northern end contains the southern end of a field system associated with the Storey Arms Inn.

Recommendations

A number of general and more specific recommendations can be made for the management of the property.

- 1. Historic and archaeological features should be retained as part of the long term management of the property.
- Care must be taken to avoid damage to historic and archaeological features.
- 3. Farmers with commoner's rights should be made aware of the locations of historical and archaeological features and of their sensitivity to agricultural activities.
- 4. Tenants should be encouraged to move animal feeding sites away from any of the features located in the survey. This is particularly marked in Glyn Tarell where sheep are being fed on top of some of the old field banks.
- 5. The farmsteads in Cwm Cynwyn (860360 and 860361) are complex monuments and would benefit from further study including a topographic survey.
- 6. Consideration should be given to commissioning a topographic survey of the enclosure 860259 which may be prehistoric in date.







Figure 4: Location of Previously Recorded Features, Cwm Cynwyn Scale 1:10,000












Figure 7: Location of Recorded Features, Cwm Sere and Cwm Cynwyn Scale 1:10,000








Figure 10: Sketch plan of Buildings 860288 and 860289 and Field System 860287 Scale 1:1000 approx.
