

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INTRODUCTION

The South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd Archaeological Assessment forms part of the second phase of the Forest Enterprise Welsh Heritage Assets Project, as specified in the Forest Enterprise Welsh Heritage Assets Project Brief. It covers 9153ha and lies within the Llanymyddyfri forest district and within the counties of Powys, Carmarthenshire and Ceredigion. The archaeological survey is intended to correct the deficiency in archaeological understanding of the forest, to lead to better management of the archaeological resource and to enhance the public understanding and enjoyment of the natural and cultural landscape in Forest Enterprise's care.

The Contracts Section of the Clwyd-Powys Archaeological Trust was awarded the contract in March 1998. Work commenced in April 1998 and was completed on 31 July 1998. The following report, gazetteer and printed maps fulfil part of the project brief. Accompanying this report are the digital data on CD-ROM and floppy disc fulfilling the other part of the project brief.

SOURCES

The following sources were consulted as part of the project. An outline of the level to which these sources were consulted follows the description of each source as does an assessment of their usefulness. A detailed list of sources consulted follows the bibliography.

The Regional Sites and Monuments Record

The South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd contract includes areas covered by the Sites and Monuments Record of two archaeological trusts, the Clwyd-Powys Archaeological Trust and Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology (formerly the Dyfed Archaeological Trust). The data were supplied separately by both trusts in digital form as FoxPro databases. The data were converted into the format required by the Forest Enterprise Welsh Heritage Assets Project Brief by CPAT Contracts.

63 sites existed in the CPAT SMR for South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd prior to the project while the SMR of Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology listed 42 sites. The grid references of five of the CPAT listed sites (PRNs 3098, 4173, 5898, 5899 and 6386) lie within the area covered by Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology while two of the sites listed in the Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology SMR (PRNs 7794 and 10542) have grid references which put them in the area covered by the CPAT SMR. This is because the sites have grid references which only locate them within a 100m area. The SMRs are the most comprehensive list of archaeological sites available and have been compiled since 1974. They include a number of sites which were identified prior to the planting of the forestry, including several cairns, enclosures and findspots. These sites would not have been identified from any other source consulted as part of the project. The present project has identified 64 new sites, 47 in the area covered by the CPAT SMR and 17 in the Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology area. The increase in sites is significantly less than in other areas which partly reflects the quality of the two SMRs and partly the nature of the archaeology in the forested areas which is largely related to the agricultural history of the region with little industrial activity. The new sites are largely made up from features noted from early Ordnance Survey maps and from a group of sites recorded by the Royal Commission on the Historical and Ancient Monuments of Wales from aerial photographs.

The Second Edition Ordnance Survey 6" maps

Copies of the second edition of the Ordnance Survey 6" maps, published in 1905 and 1906 for the survey area, were obtained as first generation photocopies from the National Library of Wales in Aberystwyth. The maps were digitised following the methodology defined in the Forest Enterprise Welsh Heritage Assets Project Brief, and incorporated in the summary of the methodology and its effectiveness included below.

The maps were found to be a useful and accurate source for identifying particular types of site including agricultural buildings, trackways, field boundaries, and areas of woodland. A number of structures were not depicted on Ordnance Survey maps, including several sheepfolds and industrial buildings.

The methodology employed in capturing this source, outlined below, meant that the maps gave an accurate location for the sites. This is estimated to be within 15m in all cases, but is generally to below 10m.

Later Editions of the Ordnance Survey

The provisional edition of the Ordnance Survey 6" map, amended in 1948 and published in 1953 in the same format as the second edition six-inch series but overprinted with the modern Ordnance Survey grid,

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was studied. This showed that the landscape had been relatively stable in the early part of the twentieth century. The planting of South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd had already commenced by this date. A large number of sheepfolds marked and named on the first edition of the 6" map, but not named on the second edition 6" map, were shown on the provisional edition.

Aerial photographs

The vertical collection of aerial photographs held in the National Monuments Record library at the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales was studied. The collection holds all the sorties and frames for the South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd area for the period from 1945 to the 1970s. It was therefore not considered necessary to consult the collection of the Central Registry for Aerial Photography held by the Welsh Office in Cardiff.

Much of the Crychan forest has been the subject of an intensive programme of site identification from aerial photographic sources by Toby Driver of the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales. This identified 18 sites which would not have been identified from any other source. The area is well covered by aerial photographic sources from the 1940s onwards with sorties flown in 1946 (106G/UK/ 1471) and 1960 (58/RAF/3916) being particularly useful. The 106G/UK/1471 did not cover the South Tywi block and only the south western part of Irfon. No new sites were identified in Glasfynydd as this had been largely planted by the time of the 1946 photography.

Forest Enterprise records

The records of the Forest Enterprise district were studied in their offices in Llanrwst. It was found that these were mainly lists of sites obtained from the Clwyd-Powys Archaeological Trust and Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology.

Forest Enterprise staff

A number of field visits were undertaken in the company of Forest Enterprise staff. This was invaluable in identifying sites of interest and in guiding field visits.

Tithe Maps

Tithe maps were studied at the National Library of Wales in Aberystwyth. Although they are the earliest cartographic depictions of most of South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd, no new sites were identified, apart from minor changes to boundaries and areas of woodland.

First Edition Ordnance Survey 6" maps.

Photocopies of the first edition of the Ordnance Survey 6" maps, dating around 1890 for the survey area, were obtained from the National Library of Wales in Aberystwyth. Comparison of the map with the second edition of the map indicated that there had been little change in the area in the second half of the nineteenth century, other than the realignment and removal of boundaries, and the clearance of small areas of woodland.

First Edition 1" maps

The first edition of the Ordnance Survey map, surveyed between 1816 and 1820 in the survey area, shows several features within the forested area and represents the earliest mapped depiction of several of the farmsteads and other features in the forest, including prehistoric sites.

Ordnance Survey Surveyors' Drawings

The Ordnance Survey surveyors drawings, compiled at 2" scale and dating to between 1816 and 1820 for the survey area, showed little difference from the 1" published map.

National Monuments Record

The National Monuments Record (NMR) was studied in the NMR library in the offices of the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments of Wales in Aberystwyth. No new sites were identified from this source.

Estate Maps and Records

The collections held in the National Library of Wales in Aberystwyth, the Carmarthenshire County Record Office and the Powys County Record Office in Llandrindod Wells were studied. The most significant collection of papers are those relating to the Crosswood Estate, including a map of Hafdre Cwm Du dating to 1781.

Although the records are of significant historical importance no new sites were identified from this source.

METHODOLOGY

The methodology used to record archaeological features in the forestry from the sources listed above is described below. Its effectiveness in recording the total archaeological resource of the Forest is also assessed.

Digital Mapping

Due to inaccuracies of the stock maps the scanning and registering methodology outlined in the CPAT specification was not employed. After agreement with the Archaeological Co-ordinator the methodology employed was to note the corner co-ordinate values of the second edition maps from the provisional editions of the Ordnance Survey maps, published in 1953. The modern grid value of points on the second edition maps were also estimated from the provisional edition and marked in pencil on the second edition maps. The second edition maps were then scanned in two parts using an A3 scanner and registered to modern grid co-ordinates using the corner points and the grid values of selected points. Digitising was conducted in MapInfo in the tables outlined in the Forest Enterprise Welsh Heritage Assets Project Brief. Where the provisional edition of the Ordnance Survey were not available the sheets were registered using the co-ordinates of selected points projected from later editions of the Ordnance Survey maps.

Errors of up to 15m were apparent in the digital data when compared to the Forest Enterprise stock maps. This was partly due to the Cassini projection of the source map differing from the projection of the modern map, and partly because of errors in the stock map data. Significant errors were also apparent due to distortion of the photocopied maps. Quality Assurance procedures followed those outlined in the project specification.

Record Creation

Databasing in the SMR1 table conformed to that defined in the Forest Enterprise Welsh Heritage Assets Project Brief. It was carried out in MapInfo using the digitised map as background. Database points created from other sources, such as those recorded during field visits but not recorded on the map sources, those recorded by Forest Enterprise staff, or those on early maps or aerial photographs, were placed with the greatest accuracy possible. Confidence in the accuracy of the site location is included in the site description where the source is derived from a source other than cartographic. Quality Assurance procedures follow those outlined in the project specification.

Field assessment

Field visits were largely made in the company of Forest Enterprise staff, which allowed easy access to the sites and meant that the safety considerations outlined in the specification could be met. Field visits were determined by the results of the digital mapping and desktop assessment. A number of sites were recorded during the field visits which had not been identified from other sources. The vegetation on the sites did not greatly hamper field recording.

Site visit forms were created to ensure that all the relevant data were recorded relating to each site. These forms form part of the project archive.

Effectiveness of the Methodology

The methodology described above has recorded 169 sites of which 64 were new sites. In particular it has been effective in identifying post-medieval features associated with the agricultural history of the area. Many of these features, particularly in the area covered by the Archaeoleg Cambria Archaeology SMR, had already been assigned PRN numbers because of a previous project which captured sites from Ordnance Survey map sources.

It should be noted that the survey is intended as a rapid survey from readily available sources. There is therefore likely to be unrecorded archaeology in the forest which can only be identified from detailed fieldwork, which lies outside the scope of this survey. This may include potentially important earthwork features such as barrows and earthwork enclosures or insubstantial structures such as cairns.

THE NATURE AND CONDITION OF THE ARCHAEOLOGY IN THE FOREST

169 records of individual sites were either created or updated as part of the project. Of these 105 were existing records and 64 are new records. A density of 0.018 sites per hectare was recorded. 113 of the sites were visited to record their condition and any potential threat, a percentage of 0.67%. The condition of the visited sites were assessed and recommendations made for better management.

The assessment area lies in a relatively sparsely populated part of Wales and the amount of archaeology in the forest reflects this. Prehistoric activity is represented by a number of features which have probably survived because of the relative lack of post-medieval and modern agricultural activity. These include the two scheduled standing stones at Pant Meddygon (PRNs 4143 and 4144; SAM Cm41(CAM)) and the scheduled barrow at Banc Paderau Barrow (PRN 814; SAM Br149(POW)) which lies just outside the boundary of the forest, but with the scheduled area extending into the forest. The scheduled sites are well preserved and are impressive monuments. Less well preserved prehistoric features include a number of burnt mounds (PRN 5894, 5897, 5899, 6385, 6386, and 8526), believed to be of Bronze Age date, which have not been identified since the planting of the forest. It is probable that they were either destroyed by pre-afforestation ploughing or they were poorly located when first identified. Recent work by the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments in Wales has identified a number of features from aerial photographs. These include hut groups such as PRN 3036, and hut and enclosure complexes such as PRN 15162, 36088 and 36101. Although the location of some of these features can be identified from the topography of their locations few of the features can be identified on the ground. Many of the sites are located in second rotation crops which are dense and in which earthwork features are virtually impossible to locate, although the features may become more readily visible as the crop matures or after clearfelling.

Some of the enclosures recorded from aerial photographic sources may be features of the Roman period, but the most likely monument dating to this period is the fortlet (PRN 273). The site straddles the Forest Enterprise boundary and is clearly visible in the agricultural land adjacent to the forest but within the densely planted plantation the ditches are barely visible.

The earliest surviving agricultural features within the forest probably date from the medieval period. They include a number of sites recorded during the project which probably have their origins as seasonal upland dwellings, or hafotai, (including Craflwyn PRN 36084, Cnwch Rhiw Talog PRN 9295 and Nant y Neuadd PRN 30176). A particularly impressive example of a site with probable medieval origins is at Llethyr Dol Ial (PRN 9267) where a stone-built house of possible early post-medieval date has been built immediately adjacent to an earlier platform of medieval date. Sites of potential medieval date have also been identified on aerial photographs, including the farmsteads at Crychan Forest West (PRN 15,159) and Gardiners Track West (PRN 36085). An early post-medieval pillow mound complex has been identified at Cefn Pal (PRN 36086). Many of the lowland farms of post medieval date in the more intensively farmed in Crychan and the eastern part of Irfon probably have their origin in the medieval period, if not earlier, but the surviving structures are mostly post medieval in date. Some of the farmsteads survive almost to their full height, including Scrach (PRN 30211), Glyn Moch (PRN 30221) and Cefn Blewog (PRN 30215). Others have been almost entirely destroyed, including Pen Lan (PRN 30223) where a forestry road was built over the top of the house. Other features of the agricultural landscape include hedgerows, trackways and areas of former deciduous woodland which survive in places, although only one distinct archaeological landscape was identified (PRN 37087).

There has been little industrial activity in the area, the only site identified during the project being Nant y Walch Quarry (PRN 23953) which now survives as a large water-filled opencast with associated buildings.

ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITE CATEGORIES

For the purposes of management, the sites recorded in the archaeological survey have been divided into five categories (A to C; No Physical Presence; Not Yet Evaluated). The broad divisions between these categories have been drawn on archaeological grounds, but each is tailored towards specific management aims. Each category is described archaeologically, lists management objectives and gives a management recommendation. Sites may be defined as a discrete monument (e.g. a farmstead, or a larger complex e.g. a field system or landscape).

Landscapes may be diverse and may include, for example, redundant field and settlement systems (comprising walls, banks, hedges, trackways, buildings or sites of buildings etc.), prehistoric ritual landscapes (such as barrow cemeteries, stone rows and settings), prehistoric settlement landscapes (such as hillforts with field systems), industrial complexes (such as areas of mining or quarrying) or relatively modern agricultural landscapes. The main criteria for selection is that the various elements should form a significant and coherent archaeological or historic whole. Survival and condition are not necessarily important when defining a landscape, for example the medieval Radnor Forest exhibits little or no surviving physical remains but it is a closely defined area where the long term exercising of Forest Law has shaped the current landuse pattern.

Using these categories, an evaluation of each site recorded during the survey has been attempted and sites labelled accordingly. This evaluation process will only be fully successful where, (a) existing records give full and up to date details of the site's form and present state of preservation, such as those already in the Sites and Monuments Record or those with detailed records made by third parties such as the RCAHMW, or (b) where a visit has been possible as part of this survey.

Where insufficient information exists, for example where a site has not been visited by an archaeologist, it will be classified as 'Not Yet Evaluated' in the database and printed gazetteer.

The categorisation of sites is an ongoing process requiring site identification and recording by Forest Enterprise in conjunction with the appropriate archaeological body. Categories are not immutable and where new information becomes available review may be considered.

The management objectives and prescriptions are intended to achieve either the preservation of archaeological remains *in-situ* (i.e. to retain and maintain the site in a stable condition and to actively protect it from further disturbance), or the preservation of archaeological remains *by record* (i.e. to preserve a record of the sites present state and form, but not necessarily to actively conserve it or protect it from further disturbance). This terminology is derived from government advice on the handling of archaeology in the planning process (PPG Wales and WO Circular 60/96) and is that in common use in archaeology

The term *national importance* is used below as defined by the *non-statutory criteria for scheduling ancient monuments*. A site, or less commonly a landscape, may meet any one of, or combination of, these seven published criteria (period, rarity, documentation, group value, survival/condition, fragility/vulnerability, diversity, potential) and be deemed of national importance and therefore merit scheduling as an ancient monument under the 1979 *Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act*. Once designated, Ancient Monuments are protected by law and special permission (Scheduled Monument Consent) is required, from the Secretary of State, for any works effecting them. Cadw, who administer Scheduled Ancient Monuments (SAMs) in Wales, and English Heritage who perform a similar function in England, may enter into management agreements with owners of such sites. Forest Enterprise already has a number of agreements in place for SAMs on its holdings. These agreements are specific to each monument and take precedence over the general management prescriptions given below. Management plans for non-scheduled sites, where needed, will be drawn up with reference to the Archaeological Co-ordinator for the project and the appropriate Archaeological Trust.

Category A

Discrete archaeological monuments of national importance

This category may include any site, whatever its form, which might meet the criteria for scheduling. It will by definition include all Scheduled Ancient Monuments (SAMs). Many sites in this category may be recommended for scheduling.

The main criteria for selection will usually be the rarity, condition and potential of the site. Typically, sites such as barrows, hillforts, linear earthworks or significant (ruined) buildings might fall in this category, although significant find scatters might equally well qualify on potential or relatively modern farmsteads on group value.

Management Objective

To maintain and enhance as a monument of national importance.

Management Prescription

Identify and record with a view to preservation in-situ.

A detailed management plan should be written for all sites in this category.

Category B

Discrete archaeological monuments and landscape features of regional or local importance

This category may include any site, whatever its form, which while not meeting the criteria for scheduling may still be seen as of regional or local importance. For example, a type of site unique to a particular locality but common elsewhere, or severely degraded examples of commonly occurring types.

Management Objective

To maintain and enhance as a monument of regional or local importance.

Management Prescription

Identify and record with a view to preserving better examples in-situ.

Category C

Discrete archaeological monuments of lesser significance

This category comprises sites which while being of archaeological or historical interest may not worthy of conservation or active protection.

Management Objective Identify and record as appropriate

Management Prescription

Identify and record sites during the course of normal forest management, with a view to preservation by record. No other archaeological management may be necessary, but conservation and protection might be offered, as appropriate, as a part of other schemes.

Category: No Physical Presence

Sites with no defined physical presence

This category comprises findspots, sites noted but not accurately located in antiquarian references, sites known only from placename evidence and other reported sites whose authenticity is in doubt (e.g. certain sites which have not been verified by recent archaeological fieldwork).

Where poorly located sites initially placed in this category are subsequently identified and recorded it may be appropriate to revise their categorisation.

Management Objective

Identify and record sites as opportunities arise. Assess their nature and condition.

Management Prescription

Identify and record site as appropriate during the course of normal forest management. Sites that cannot be located cannot be managed.

Category: Not Yet Evaluated

Sites which have not yet been evaluated

This category includes all sites which have not been evaluated. This may be because they have not yet been visited or because it has not proved possible to find them but they have not been shown conclusively to have been destroyed.

Management Objective Sites such be located and visited to allow evaluation by a competent archaeologist.

Management Prescription

None is possible until such sites have been evaluated.

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FURTHER WORK

Scheduling Recommendations

The amount of archaeology in the South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd forest area is relatively low compared with other studied areas. It does however contain three existing scheduled sites. Only one further site is considered to be of sufficient importance to merit scheduling.

Llethr Dol Iar (PRN 9267)

An early post-medieval house site which is located next to a medieval platform house on a different alignment. Consideration should be given to scheduling because of its good condition of survival and group value.

Sites for interpretation

The South Tywi/Irfon/Crychan/Glasfynydd forest area is in a sparsely populated part of Wales. Visitor numbers are not as high as those in other parts of Wales and therefore the potential of sites for public interpretation is limited. Furthermore parts of Crychan are used by the army and are designated as danger areas.

Llethr Dol Iar (PRN 9267)

A house site with the remains of early post-medieval and medieval houses which are illustrative of a sequence of house building styles. It is not located close to any other archaeological features or picnic site so access to site could be a problem.

Pant Meddygon (PRN 4143 and 4144)

The scheduled Bronze Age standing stones lie close to the Usk reservoir which is a popular tourist location. The standing stones would benefit from public interpretation boards.

DESCRIPTION OF THE ARCHAEOLOGY OF SOUTH TYWI/IRFON/CRYCHAN/GLASFYNYDD

The assessment area covers a large and dispersed area. The South Tywi block lies in an upland area which was largely used as rough grazing land prior to the planting of the forest in the 1950s as was most of Irfon. The Crychan block was more intensively farmed prior to afforestation while Glasfynydd was again largely an upland area used for rough grazing.

The earliest evidence of human activity dates from the Bronze Age period and is represented by two scheduled standing stones at Pant Meddygon (PRN 4143 and 4144; SAM Cm41(CAM)) and the scheduled barrow at Banc Paderau (PRN 814; SAM Br149(POW)) which lies just outside the boundary of the forest. Prehistoric finds include two flint arrowheads found at Mynydd Wysg (PRN 3135), believed to be of Bronze Age date, and a Neolithic find from Trawsllwyndu (PRN 4150). Less well preserved prehistoric features include a number of burnt mounds (PRNs 5894, 5897, 5899, 6385, 6386, and 8526), believed to be of Bronze Age date, which have not been identified since the planting of the forest. Recent work by the Royal Commission on the Ancient and Historical Monuments in Wales has identified a number of features of potential prehistoric date from aerial photographs. These include a hut group (PRN 3036) and three hut and enclosure complexes (PRNs 15162, 36088 and 36101). The only evidence of Roman activity is the fortlet which survives on the edge of Crychan (PRN 273).

The earliest surviving agricultural features within the forest probably date from the medieval period. They include a number of sites recorded during the project which probably have their origins as seasonal upland dwellings, or hafotai, (including Craflwyn PRN 36084, Cnwch Rhiw Talog PRN 9295 and Nant y Neuadd PRN 30176). A particularly impressive example of a site with probable medieval origins is at Llethr Dol Iar (PRN 9267) where a stone built house of possible early post-medieval date has been built immediately adjacent to an earlier platform of medieval date. Sites of potential medieval date have also been identified on aerial photographs during work by the RCAHMW, including the farmsteads at Crychan Forest West (PRN 15159) and Gardiners Track West (PRN 36085). An early post-medieval pillow mound complex for rearing rabbits has been identified at Cefn Pal (PRN 36086).

In Crychan the agricultural history of the post medieval period is well represented. Surviving farmsteads include Scrach (PRN 30211), Glyn Moch (PRN 30221) and Cefn Blewog (PRN 30215) which survive to almost their full height. Hedgerows, trackways and areas of former deciduous woodland also survive in places.

There has been little industrial activity in the area, the only site identified during the project being Nant y Walch Quarry (PRN 23953) which now survives as a large water-filled open-cast with associated buildings.




Key Map 1: South Tywi and Irfon








Key Map 2: Crychan and Glasfynydd


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





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
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
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
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


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


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





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
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
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
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


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


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





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
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
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
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
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
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
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


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
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



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


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





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
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




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


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
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
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


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
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



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


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


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


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
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
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
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
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
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
